BOARD NOMINATIONS

Nomination forms and cover letters were sent to all MRC members on September 12. The deadline to return nominations was October 15, 2024. There are six open slots to fill: three 3-year terms (January 1, 2025 – December 31, 2027), two unexpired terms ending December 2026 and one unexpired term ending December 2025. Nominations for MRC Board of Directors will be presented at the October 23rd Board meeting.

EPR UPDATE

In August, the Municipal Review Committee (MRC) submitted a public comment supporting the Maine DEP's proposed Chapter 428, Extended Producer Responsibility (EPR) rule. The MRC highlighted the potential benefits for its 115 member communities and the Hampden facility, operated by Municipal Waste Solutions (MWS). We emphasized recognizing anaerobic digestion in the rules and advocated for utilizing larger facilities like MWS to enhance recycling efforts statewide. Read the full public comment here.

MRF UPDATE

Phase 1 funding for the updates and design changes to the Materials Recovery Facility (MRF), requested in September, has been approved and finalized by the White Oak Board of Directors. This funding, exceeding \$20 million, will initiate revisions to the MRF construction. In late August and early September, Innovative placed a significant deposit on critical equipment for the MRF, including machines designed to open bags at the start of the recovery process. capitalizing on a unique opportunity. The next funding request will cover the investment needed for the Anaerobic Digestion (AD) system. While the design and engineering for the AD system are still being finalized, a substantial amount will also be requested for this project.

WELCOME TO THE MWS TEAM

Municipal Waste Solutions is excited to announce two key additions to its team. Gary Hartmann has been hired as Chief Operating Officer (COO) and started on-site on September 9th.
